

A winning combination



THE RED PLANET

Long ago, people marveled at a light in the sky that was different from the others. It glowed reddish orange. The ancient Romans named this light Mars, their god of war.

Standards link: Earth Science: Students know there are planets that orbit the sun.

How old would you

The time it takes a planet to orbit the sun is called a year. The Earth takes 365 days to orbit the sun, making our year 365 days long.

Mars is farther away from the sun and it takes longer to orbit. A Martian year is 687 days long.

Here's how to figure out how old you would be on Mars:

- Multiply your age in years by 365. This will tell you how many days old you are.
- Divide that number by 687 days. That will tell you how many Martian years old you are!

Out Of This World Volcano!

The largest volcano in the solar system is on Mars. It is called **Olympus Mons**. It rises 17 miles (27 km) above the surrounding land – that's three times higher than Mt. Everest, Earth's tallest mountain. If Olympus Mons was on Earth, its base would cover the entire state of Washington and nearly half of Oregon.

The Grandest Canyon of All

An enormous canyon near Mars' equator stretches one quarter of the way around the planet. Some people call it the Grand Canyon of Mars, after Earth's famous canyon in Arizona. Its real name is **Valles Marineris**. If Valles Marineris started in Los Angeles, California, where would it end? To find out, follow the maze!






2. Stretch out one hand with the palm facing up.




